| Economic Development Commission | <p>Seven members. Terms are coterminous.</p> <p>One member is needed. Commissioner Foy's appointment.</p> | Promote economic development and to establish a framework to be utilized in coordinating local, state and federal efforts toward this end. Major emphasis shall be placed on providing the basic facilities essential for attracting and encouraging sound economic growth in the county. |

| Name | Requirements | Purpose |
| Juvenile Crime Prevention Council | <p>Juvenile Justice Reform Act signed into law October 28, 1998 (Governor James B. Hunt, Jr.). A prerequisite for a county to receive funding shall be that county commissioners must appoint a Juvenile Crime Prevention Council, which is composed of up to 25 members. Chair and vice chair shall be elected annually by council members. Terms of appointment - Two years.</p> <p>Person under 18 years of age Person under 18 years of age Business Community Public Representative</p> | Reduce and prevent juvenile crime by assessing the needs of the juveniles in the county on an annual basis who are at risk of delinquency or who have been adjudicated, undisciplined or delinquent, reviewing the resources available to address those needs, determining services needed to address problem areas, developing a request for proposal for services in need and providing funds for needed services. |
